Certification and Accreditation

You will hear the words Accreditation and Certification used a lot over the coming months. What does this mean for you as a Strata Manager, why is it important, and how do you go about obtaining these credentials?

Accreditation and Certification are two sides of the coin when it comes to increasing the professionalism of the strata sector in Western Australia, and in promoting SCA (WA) Members as the top choice when choosing a Strata Manager.

Strata Management Practice Standard (SMPS)

Certification is a business level program, allowing strata management business teams to work together to be recognised as an organisation of professional, educated and experienced Strata Community Managers, with an ongoing commitment to best practice and continual improvement. Give your company the opportunity to state you are certified and all your managers are accredited.

You may be asking, "Why is this important?", well, to develop the professional standard of the strata sector and promote the extra value of SCA members, it is important for there to be standards and levels that members can demonstrate they have achieved and exceeded.

In 2021 the SCA (WA) members voted to amend the constitution, ensuring that all members would have achieved SMPS Certification by 30 June 2026, or within two years of submitting an application to become a member.

This date seems a long way away, however, as the Certification is reliant on employees having achieved certain levels of accreditation, it is important to review the tenure requirements at each level to make sure you do not leave it too late.

To become a SMPS Certified Strata Management Business, you must have:

- Current Financial Membership with SCA (WA) in good standing for more than two years
- At least one staff member who has Level 2 SCA Accreditation of Certified Strata Community Manager (CSCM).
- An audited Strata Management Business Manual

To maintain your business certification:

- By year two, you must have 50% of your Strata Community Manager employees at Level 1 Accredited Strata Community Manager (ASCM).
- By year four, you must have 80% of your Strata Community Manager employees at Level 1 Accredited Strata Community Manager (ASCM).


